What is Jesus' wish list for you?

- That you might come to know him as the Christ, the Son of God ("If you really know me, you will know my Father as well"- Jn. 14:7).
- 2) That by knowing Him as Christ, you would you would have life eternal (Everyone who believes may have eternal life- Jn. 3:16).
- 3) That you would be with Him forever (My Father's house has many rooms; if that were not so, would I have told you that I am going there to prepare a place for you? And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back and take you to be with me that you also may be where I am-Jn. 14:2).

- 5) That we be included in God's kingdom (No one comes to the Father except through me- Jn. 14:6).

- 7) Thus, He will carry our burdens for us (He tends his flock like a shepherd: He gathers the lambs in his arms and carries them close to his heart- Isaiah 40:11).

Not Catholic, not Protestant:

Recently, I was asked if Sunrise Christian Church is a Protestant church. A Protestant church is one that broke away from the Catholic Church because of its excesses, thus "protesting" it.

These churches are normally known as mainline churches- Lutheran, Presbyterian, Anglican (Episcopal in the USA) are the main ones since they originally came from the Catholic church. Yet with these we probably could add the Methodists as they branched off from the Anglican church. And from the Methodist denomination a host of others as well.

Yet there are other denominations that pre-date the Catholic Church; the Orthodox Churches, for example.

The Christian Churches, of which Sunrise Christian Church is one, plus the Churches of Christ and the Disciples of Christ, all came out of a movement that had no single leader, yet had the same goal of trying to live out what was found in the New Testament. In a sense, they simply wanted to re-invent themselves to be what the Bible is calling Christians to be. Therefore, in a very real way, it was not a break from another denomination but rather the start of something new, which was as old as the first churches.

The early Christians and Disciples, as they like to call themselves, had a motto that is still appropriate yet today: "We are Christians only, but not the only Christians."

Another feature of the Christian Church is our high regard for the Bible: "Where the Scripture speaks, we speak; where the Scriptures are silent, we are silent."

The weekly celebration of the Lord's Supper, baptism for remission of sins and reception of the Holy Spirit, and an elder-lead congregation are other identifying features of the Christian Church; that, plus a willingness to fellowship with any who claim Jesus as Lord.

Words, words and more words

Through the use of words, we communicate important and complicated thoughts. Civilization is built and things get done because of words.

Yes, some things, love for example, can be communicated by a simple touch; but for anything more that this you need words.

So, it's through the spoken word that the message of Christ is shared. Yes, pictures can help, but words can help even more- especially when they are combined with love!

The early church went everywhere sharing the gospel message of hope. The book of Acts tells us that there was a time when a great persecution broke out against the church (Acts 8). And what did the church do? The Bible says that those scattered "preached the word wherever they went" (Acts 8:4).

This agrees with what was written to the church in Rome: "How then will they call on him in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in him of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without someone preaching? And how are they to preach unless they are sent? As it is written, 'How beautiful are the feet of those who preach good news'"- Romans 10:14-16, ESV.

Now is the time to put your words to use for the kingdom of God and the well-being of those around you who do not have a saving relationship with Christ. Remember, though many have heard about him, not many know him. To know and be known is what is important.

So, 1) Learn to share you "God story"everyone has a unique story as to how they came to faith in Christ; keeping it short but to the point. 2) Share that coming to Christ is a turning away from the past. We must leave the old to pick up the new. 3) They will need to know the steps of faith- Trust in Christ as Lord and Savior, Repentance from sins, and immersion into Christ's powerful name. Young or old, all must do this. 4) The other is that a person should not, cannot be a lone Christian. We all need a circle of friends and acquaintances to spur us on, and the church is God's idea for doing this. It is also the place to learn to serve others, since God's kingdom is about others (Eph. 4:12-13). Words, words and more words. Whatever it takes, for however long it takes- make your words count!
